A Copy of the Minule of the Synod of N-York met<sup>575</sup>  
at Philadelphia.

At a meeting of the Synod of New-York September 3. 1755.

A Petition was brought into the Synod setting forth of the  
city of erecting a new Presbytery in Virginia: The Synod therefore  
appoint g. Revd. Samuel Davies, John Todd, Alexander Braghead,  
Robert Henry, John Wright, & John Brown, to be a Presbytery,  
under instance of the Presbytery of Hanover: & of their first meeting  
shall be in Hanover on the first Wednesday of December next; & that  
Mr. Davies open the Presbytery by a Sermon: & that any of our  
Members settling to the Southward & Westward of Mr. Hogg's bound  
congregation, shall have liberty to joyn the Presbytery of Hanover.

Hanover, December 3. The Presbytery of Hanover met  
according to the above Constitution & appointment, Mr. Davies  
Moderator & Mr. Todd Clerk. Ubi post Petere fuderunt, Mfrs.<sup>20</sup>  
Samuel Davies, Robert Henry, John Brown & John Todd,  
ministers. Elders, Samuel Morris, Alexander Joice, John  
MacCoy; Mfrs.<sup>21</sup> Braghead & Wright absent.

Mr. Davies being sick, requested Mr. Todd to preach for him, &  
accordingly, the Presbytery was opened by him, by a sermon from  
Zephaniah. The 4-7.

The Synod of N-York having appointed that a day of fasting  
& Prayer be held in all the congregations within their bounds,  
on account of the present critical & alarming state of great  
Britain & the British Plantations in America; & having left  
it to the discretion of each Presbytery to determine the partic-  
ular days; this Presbytery therefore appoint next Tuesday eve-

56; Day, to be set apart for that Purpose; because of the retrospect it may have to the important Transactions of the last year; the Prospect it may bear to the ensuing Year, which may be equally interesting & important; & that we may have the Encouragement of Friends in our united Requests to the Throne of Grace, with the Presbytery of Newcastle, who have appointed the same Day

The Presbytery appoint m<sup>r</sup>. Brown to give timely Notice hereof to m<sup>r</sup>. Craighead, & m<sup>r</sup>. Henry to do the same to m<sup>r</sup>. Wright &

The Synod having recommended to all the congregations within their bounds, to raise a Collection for the College of New-Jersey; the Presbytery having taken the Affair under consideration, Judge, that considering the present impoverish'd State of the Colony, in general, & of our congregations in particular, such a Proposal would be quite impracticable; & appoint that the Members that attend the Synod next year, report the same to the Synod.

A Petition directed to m<sup>r</sup>. Davies & m<sup>r</sup>. Todd, from People living near the mountains in Albemarle, near Wood's Gap; was referred by them to the Presbytery; representing Heedless Circumstances; in the want of gospel Ordinances, & requesting some Supplies from us; — The Presbytery therefore, appoint, the Revd. Sam<sup>d</sup>. Davies to preach there, on the 2<sup>d</sup>. Sabbath in March next; & that m<sup>r</sup>. Brown desire some of the People to appoint the Place of meeting, to be out of the Bounds of m<sup>r</sup>. Blaikie's Congregation, at some convenient Place.

The Presbytery appoint m<sup>r</sup>. John Todd to be their constant Clerk.

Adjourned until the Thursday after the 2<sup>d</sup>. Sabbath of March next, to meet at Providence, & appoint that m<sup>r</sup>. Henry open the Presbytery by a Sermon.

Providence March 14<sup>th</sup> 1756 A.D.

The Presbytery met according to appointment, ubi 1756  
post Preces fidevant. Messrs<sup>rs</sup> Samuel Davies, Robert Henry,  
John Wright & John Todd, Ministers. — Samuel Morris, Saml.  
Davies, Charles Anderson & Tucker Woodson, Elders. — Absent,  
Messrs<sup>rs</sup> Alexander Braghead, & John Brown.

M<sup>r</sup>. Henry opened the Presbytery with a Sermon from 2<sup>d</sup>.  
Cor. 3.10. according to appointment.

M<sup>r</sup>. Todd chosen Moderator, M<sup>r</sup>. Davies Clerk.

Ordered the minutes of our last to be read. — The Reason of  
M<sup>r</sup>. Wright's Absence from our last Sustained. — But the Pres-  
bytery earnestly recommend it to all the Members to be par-  
ticularly conscientious in attending for the future.

Petitions for Supplies were brought in subscribed by many People from  
Buckingham in Albemarle: also from the People inhabiting between the  
Secretary's Ford & the Mountains in said County; also from the Haw-  
Fields, Leno & Kies, in North Carolina. — A Petition from above 50  
Subscribers in Prince Edward County, for the one half of M<sup>r</sup>. Wright's  
ministerial Labour: a Petition from Orange County, N<sup>th</sup> Carolina  
for Supplies.

All the Members present have complied with the Appointment of our  
last, in observing New Year's Day as a Day of Fasting & Prayer, on  
account of the present posture of our publick Affairs.

M<sup>r</sup>. Davies has complied with his Appointment in preaching near  
the Mountains.

A verbal representation being made of the necessitous situation  
of the People in Chesterfield County, Mecklenburg, & slate  
River & the North Garden in Albemarle, & of their earnest desire  
to hear the gospel from some of our Members: The Presbytery conclude  
to consider them as vacant Congregations, to which they will ap-  
point Supplies, as far as possible. But it is recommended to such  
Congregations as desire our labours for the future, to send Petitions  
for that purpose.

The Presbytery finding that that part of M<sup>r</sup>. Wright's congregation  
situated about Will's Creek have not been affir'd of the Application  
from Prince Edward County for the half of his ministerial labour,

& consequently could not make a Representation on their Part, the  
consideration of said Petition is referred to our next, & Mr<sup>r</sup> Wright  
is appointed to give that Party timely Notice.

Mr<sup>r</sup> Wright is appointed to supply the first & second Sunday of June  
at Errol, the Hawfields & Hild. in North Carolina.

Mr<sup>r</sup> Todd is appointed to supply Two Sabbaths between Buck Island  
& the Mountains, & to preach on a Week-day at the North-garden.

Mr<sup>r</sup> Davies is appointed to preach a Week-day at Mcherrin.

Mr<sup>r</sup> Brown is appointed to preach one Sabbath at Discretion in Alber-  
marle, between the Mountains & the Secretary's Ford, beforeat this  
& the first of September next. & that the Moderator inform him  
in Time. Mr<sup>r</sup> Brown is also appointed to preach at Mr<sup>r</sup> Charles  
Lewis's at Buck Island, the Sabbath preceding our next S<sup>r</sup>ly.

Mr<sup>r</sup> Henry is appointed to preach one Sunday at Discretion at  
State River, one at Mcherrin, done at Halifax, beforeat this Time  
& September next.

Mr<sup>r</sup> Braghead is appointed to supply 2 Sabbaths in the Vacancies  
in Augusta, between this & September next.

Adjourned to Mr<sup>r</sup> Woodson's at Goochland Court-House at 7 o'Clock  
this Evening — Concluded with Prayer.

A Petition being presented to the Presbytery for Supplies from the People  
near the Mountains in Albemarle County, & a Representation being  
made by Mr<sup>r</sup> Davies, of the Circumstances of some of them particularly  
with regard to their Connections with the Rev<sup>r</sup> Mr<sup>r</sup> Black,  
the Presbytery after the most mature Deliberation, came to the  
following Conclusions.

So That as the Synods of N<sup>r</sup> York & Philadelphia are distinct Bodies,  
the People under their care have an undoubted Right to choose what par-  
ticular Synod they shall attend to. Upon this Principle the Members  
of both Synods have acted in the Northern Provinces. And the Pres-  
byteries of Donegal in particular, have proceeded so far as to judge  
a Case that had before been determined by the Presbytery of N<sup>r</sup> Castle,  
belonging to the Synod of N<sup>r</sup> York; & acquitted & received into their  
communion a Person whom they had laid under Ban<sup>r</sup>ge. And  
some Ministers of both Parties have come to this Agreement,  
that when any Person in their respective congregations, should  
desire to be Dismissed, & make Application for a Certificate,  
they should grant it, if the Person be otherwise a regular

Church-members.

2. That as a great number of the Seditious have not, & never had, any connection with the Revd. Mr. Black, this alone is a sufficient reason for appointing Supplies for those parts. — yet
3. That it be given, & it is hereby given, as an Instruction to each of the Members of this Presbytery, as may be appointed to supply in those parts, as may be otherwise concient with the People, that they recommend Peace & forbearance to them, & particularly, that they shew a proper tenderness for Mr. Black's character, so that no measures be taken to alienate people from him, while he continues a regular Minister, or to raise a ferment contentions among them.
4. That such as have been subscribers to Mr. Black, fully discharge their Subscriptions, & make application to him & his Session, in a humble & peaceable manner, for a certificate, before they leave him.
5. That if a certificate be refused to such as are not chargeable with Immorality, or any thing inconsistent with Church-membership, they shall produce a certificate under the hands of such of their Neighbours & acquaintance as are of unblamable character, or be recommended by them & thereupon, they may be admitted to Church-privileges.
6. That tho' the People have an undoubted right to fix upon a Place of Worship, according to their convenience; yet the Presbytery recommend it to them, for the sake of Peace, to appoint a Place without the bounds of Mr. Black's congregation, & that it be as far down towards the Secretary's Todd, as will possibly suit with their convenience.

Mr. Todd is appointed to send a copy of this minute to Joseph Kincaid, to be communicated to the Persons concerned.

Mr. John Martin offered himself upon Trial for the gospel Ministry, & delivered a Discourse upon Ephes. 4. which was sustainted as a Man of Integrity; he was also examined as to his religious experiences, & the reasons of his designing the ministry, which was also sustainted. He was likewise examined in the Latin & Greek languages, & briefly in Logick, Ontology, Ethics, natural Philosophy, Historie, Geography, & Astronomy; in all which his answers in general were very satisfactory. And the Presbytery appoint him to preach a sermon on 1 Cor. 10:22, 23. on the subject on their question, Num. Revelatio Supernaturalis sit Necessaria? to be delivered at our

next

next Committee. And the said appoint messrs. Todd, Wright & Davies  
a Committee for that purpose to meet at the lower Meeting-House  
in Hanover, on the last Wednesday in April. es

M<sup>r</sup>. Wright laid before the Presbytery the case of one manus M<sup>r</sup>. Brice,  
who for some time has been excluded from Church Privileges, on  
account of a report that he had a wife in Ireland, & during her life,  
married another in America: the Presbytery considering that the  
said M<sup>r</sup>. Brice, as appears from his certificates, was admitted to  
communion by M<sup>r</sup>. Paul in Holingham some years, where he  
settled upon his first coming into the County, & that the said Report  
is not so well attested, as that it may be received as an Evidence in  
any Judicature; do Judge, that he ought to be restored to Church  
Privileges.

The Presbytery considering the present critical state of our publick  
Affairs, & that it is proper to impress upon the minds of our People,  
those religious sentiments which are agreeable to it, do appoint  
the first Tuesday in April to be religiously observed in all our Con-  
gregations as a day of fasting & prayer, or of thanksgiving, as the  
Posture of Affairs may then require.

Adjourned to the first Wednesday of July, to meet at Goochland  
Court-House: the Presbytery to be opened with a sermon by  
M<sup>r</sup>. Martin, in case the Committee approve of his next Trials,  
otherwise by M<sup>r</sup>. Davies. Concluded with Prayer. es

The Presbytery enter upon the consideration of m<sup>r</sup>. Martin's Two  
Discourses, & approved them as parts of Trial.

M<sup>r</sup>. Davies & m<sup>r</sup>. Todd having drawn up an Address in the Name of  
this Presbytery, to be presented to his Excellency & Earl of Loudoun,  
upon his arrival in H<sup>r</sup>-port, f Presbytery approve of it, & adopt it as  
their Act: & it is as follows.

To the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup> John Earl of Loudoun, supreme  
Governor of f Colony & Dominion of Virginia, Commander in  
chief of his majesty's forces in America, &c. The humble Address  
of f Presbytery of Hanover in Virginia.

May it please your Excellency,

The Presbytery of Hanover, in f Name of f Protestant Dissenters  
of f Presbyterian Denomination in this Colony, most humbly  
beg leave to present to your Excellency, thro' this medium, our  
sincere congratulations upon your safe Arrival in America,  
& your Reception to the Government of this Colony.

We esteem it an high Honour conferred upon this Dominion  
& most gratefully resent it as a fresh instance of his majesty's  
paternal goodness, that f Government of it is invested in one  
whose noble birth, whose military skill & bravery, & whose unshaken  
loyalty & activity in f service of his royal master, so conspicuously  
displayed in a vigorous opposition to f last unnatural  
rebellion, afford us f most encouraging prospect of a happy  
Administration, in f present alarming situation of this country;  
which has been so long ravaged, almost with impunity, by a  
mongrel race of French & Indian savages.

We beg leave to give your Excellency f strongest assurance  
that as we are gratefully sensible of our peculiar Happiness

under of British Government, & of gracious & equitable Administration  
of y<sup>e</sup> best of Kings; & as we warmly resent, with a just Indignation, of per-  
fidious Encroachments of y<sup>e</sup> French, those cruel Enemies to Liberty  
& Britons, upon y<sup>e</sup> Territories secured to y<sup>e</sup> British Crown by y<sup>e</sup> Faith  
of Treaties, & of inhumane Barbarities & Depredations perpetrated  
upon our Frontiers by them, & y<sup>e</sup> Indian Savages thro' their In-  
stigation; we shall zealously exert our utmost Influence, in our  
respective Provinces, to make our People justly sensible of y<sup>e</sup>  
important Interests now at Stake, to inspire y<sup>e</sup> w<sup>t</sup> a publick spirit,  
& y<sup>e</sup> Love of their Country, & to animate them by our Instruc-  
tions & Example, bravely to hazard their Lives & Fortunes in  
the Defence.

As we humbly presume to vie with our Fellow-subjects, in  
Duty to his majesty, & in a zealous Attachment to his Family &  
Government; & cheerfully submit to y<sup>e</sup> usual Tests of Loyalty &  
orthodoxy imposed by Authority upon Protestant Dissenters;  
we humbly solicit your Excellency's patronage, & put ourselves  
under your Protection; assured, your Excellency will continue to  
us those Liberties we have enjoyed, particularly y<sup>e</sup> free Exercise  
of our Religion, according to our Conscience, & y<sup>e</sup> Practice of  
y<sup>e</sup> established Church of Scotland; & humbly hoping, that whereso  
we have in Times past lain under some Measurants, from which  
our Brethren in ~~England~~, under y<sup>e</sup> same religious Establishment,  
are happily exempted, your Excellency will grant us all y<sup>e</sup> Liberties  
& Immunities of a full Toleration, according to y<sup>e</sup> Laws of England,  
& particularly according to an Act of Parliament commonly  
called y<sup>e</sup> Act of Toleration.

We cannot forbear intimating, what great Pleasure & Con-  
sideration it would yield us, & our Countrymen in general, if your  
Excellency should condescend to assume y<sup>e</sup> Administration upon  
yourself in Person, & honour this Colony with your Stated Residence  
in it, when you have passed thro' those scenes of business,  
Fatigue, & Danger, in y<sup>e</sup> Field, to which y<sup>e</sup> cause of your  
Country now calls you :-

It is, and shall be, our daily earnest Prayer to g Supreme Ruler of g Universe, that your Excellency, under g guardianship & conduct of Providence, may lead on our Armies to Honour, Victory, & Triumph — That g present & future Ages may celebrate you, as g Deliverer & Protector of these infant Colonies in America; & particularly of this which has g Honour to be your immediate care. — That having long & successfully served your King & Country, you may be advanced to the untroubled Tranquility, & superior Honour, of a happy Immortality. — These are our ardent wishes & Prayers; & we dare affirm, they are g wishes & Prayers of g Presbyterians in general, within this Dominion.

The Presbytery further examined m<sup>r</sup> Martin in sundry extempore Questions upon various Branches of Learning, & Divinity, & reheard his religious Experience; & upon a review of g sundry Trials he has passed thro' they judge him qualified to preach g gospel; & he having declared his Assent to, & approbation of g Westminster Confession of Truth, & Catechisms, & Directory, as they have been adopted by g Synod of N<sup>r</sup>. York, g Presbytery do license & authorize him to preach as a candidate for g ministry of g gospel, & recommend to g acceptance of g churches. And they direct Mr Davies & m<sup>r</sup> Todd to draw up for him a certificate, according to g purport of this minute, and appoint g moderator to give him some solemn Instructions & Admonitions, with regard to g discharge of his office. — which was done accordingly.

A Petition from g Session of g North-mountain Congregation in Augusta, was presented to g Presbytery, requesting that one of g members may be sent thither to moderate in g session in determining a difference between m<sup>r</sup> Brown & James Ballifon.

A Petition from Leno & g Haw-fields for supplies, & particularly for m<sup>r</sup> Martin.

A Petition from g North-mountain Congregation for supplies.

Also from Tanguiver & Lee Esq.

Adjourned till Tomorrow morning, at 6 o'clock — Concluded with Prayer.

7/26 Thursday August 26<sup>th</sup> The Presbytery met according to Appointm't.  
ubi post dictis fideiunct qui supra, except m<sup>r</sup> Todd, who had leave to go home.

Ordered y<sup>e</sup> minutes of y<sup>e</sup> last fideiunct to be read.

The Presbytery consider'd y<sup>e</sup> petition from y<sup>e</sup> North mountain Congregation; &  
as m<sup>r</sup> Brown is not now a Prosecutor, but willing to drop y<sup>e</sup> complaint;  
we recommend it to James Ballison to do y<sup>e</sup> same, & to bury all matter  
of past difference in perpetual oblivion. But if he is not willing to  
drop y<sup>e</sup> prosecution against m<sup>r</sup> Brown, he must regularly enter  
his complaint before y<sup>e</sup> Presbytery, before which alone it can be  
tried; as m<sup>r</sup> Brown is not subject to an inferior Judicature.

M<sup>r</sup> Martin is appointed to preach at Buck Island y<sup>e</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> Sabbath of

& y<sup>e</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> of October; y<sup>e</sup> 2<sup>d</sup> of October at Discretion; y<sup>e</sup> 3<sup>d</sup> at m<sup>r</sup> Henry's.

The Presbytery concur in Mr. Fattille's taking the ball presented to him under his consideration; but with this limitation, that he do not accept it before our next Presbytery, & have an opportunity of seeing whether the way be clear for so doing.

James Ballison entered a general complaint against the Revd. Mr. Brown, & the Presbytery desire him to draw up his complaint more explicitly in order that it may be judged of at our next, & also that the evidences, Samuel Downy, John Trimble & James Phillips, attend in person on the Presbytery or send their evidences taken upon oath before a magistrate, & that Mr. Brown appear & make his defense. — Adjourned till 10 o'clock last meridiem, concluded with Prayer.

The Presbytery, after very deliberate Consideration of the Affairs laid before them by the People of Rock Fish, find, that it took its Rise before the Union of the Synods of New York & Philadelphia; that it was considered by a Committee of the Presbytery of Donegal, and had by them been referred to said Presbytery, tho' the Revenue was not sent till after the Union of the Synods; that the Majority of the People there are desirous it should be tried by the Presbytery of Hanover, and a Number, that it should still lie under the Consideration of that of Donegal; & upon the whole, that it is so circumstanced in its and sundry other Respects, that the Decision of it by either would probably be attended with bad Consequences, and not answer the pacific Ends in View; and therefore the Presbytery agree, earnestly to recommend it to all the Parties concerned, to refer the Matter to the Synod of N. York & Philadelphia, at its next Meeting, to which both Presbyteries belong, and in which the Ministers with whom all the Parties were formerly connected, are now incorporated: And they are the more urgent in their Recommendation, as the Peace of the Church

The Honour of Religion in Virginia, and the good Effects of the Synodical Union, very much depend upon a wise and unanimous Determination of it.

And tho' the Presbytery would by no Means pre-judge the Affair, nor usurp the Cognizance of a Matter previously submitted to a Co-ordinate Judicature; yet as that People since the Union, are no longer under the Care of the Presby of Donegal, but that of Hanover; as it appears doubtful to the Presbytery, whether the Rev<sup>d</sup> Mr Black was ever received by them as their proper Pastor; as his confessed Immoralities are the Reason they assign, for their Disaffection with his Ministry; and it does not appear, that the People have done any thing to forfeit their Right to Church Privileges, and particularly the preaching of the Gospel; as it appears Mr Black himself had agreed to give up that Congregation; and as the Union of the Synods leaves the People in the full Possession of their Liberties to chuse their own Minister, and their Attachment to Mr Black's Ministry, in his present Circumstances, can by no means be made a Term of Communion; the Presbytery judge it necessary to make some Provision for that Congregation, till their Cause be tried; and therefore appoint Mr Craig, Mr Miller, Mr Brown, and Mr Pattullo, to preach there each of them one Sabbath betwixt this and the next Synod: but they recommend it to them to do it gratis, and urge the People to pay to Mr Black what may be due for the several Ministers.

759 Peace and Harmony in the Churches, which the Union between the Synods was intended to promote; & as the synod is to meet so soon, when the Matter will may be more fully considered; and they humbly presume the synod will excuse this little Variation from their Order for the sake of Peace; they agree, as far as it is in their Power, to allow Mr Craig & Mr Miller, to act only as Correspondents at the present session. 7. That while the Presbytery is transacting Business there shall be no unseasonable private Whispering, or Conversation on other Affairs, but all shall attend with Gravity & Decency.
8. If any Member act indecently & disorderly, contrary to these Rules, the Moderator shall reprove or otherwise censure him, as the Presbytery shall judge proper; & if
