El *Constitutionnel*, órgano oficioso del gobierno imperial, ha hecho a su vez las reflexiones siguientes: «La palabra del jefe de la Iglesia, tratando de los intereses espirituales, merece ser acogida con el mas profundo respeto, y nosotros nos inclinaremos siempre ante la mas alta autoridad que en estas materias haya en el mundo. Pero el Soberano Pontífice ha tocado en esta alocucion consideraciones politicas que pertenecen a nuestras libres apreciaciones. Que nos sea permitido desde hoi deplorar el antagonismo que el Papa Pio IX ha proclamado entre la Iglesia y la civilizacion moderna. 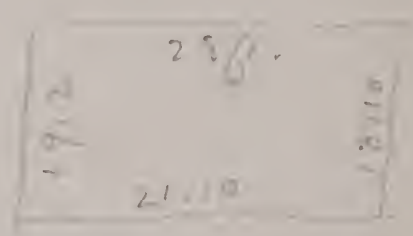
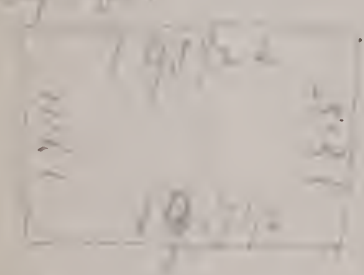

International Courtesies.

On Thursday, the 30th of January last, His Excellency, THOMAS H. NELSON, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to Chile, accompanied by the Hon.' CHARLES S. RAND, Secretary of Legation, was escorted by the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, Señor don MANUEL ALCALDE, to the saloon of His Excellency, the President, in the Palace, for the purpose of presenting to His Excellency, an autograph letter from the President of the United States, acknowledging the receipt of one from His Excellency announcing his elevation to the Presidency of Chile, and congratulating him upon so auspicious an event.

The Envoy was received most courteously by the President, who was attended by his Cabinet, and saluting His Excellency, addressed him as follows:

MR. PRESIDENT.

I have been deputed to deliver to your Excellency, an autograph letter, from the President of the United States, acknowledging the receipt of that of your Excellency, apprising him of your elevation to the Supreme Magistracy of this Republic, an event, upon which, I am directed to offer you, in person,

sincere congratulations, to your Excellency, that the President of the United States, has the kindly sentiments of his Government for your Excellency and the

agreeable duty, to acknowledge the good will and just disposition of the Government of the United States, for the prompt recognition of Chile, in promptly recognizing the claims of Chile, in promptly recognizing reparation for accidental injuries to the interests of citizens of the United States, and to express the high regard of the Government I have the honor to acknowledge the praiseworthy efforts of the Government of Chile, to remove every cause of complaint, and the Government of the United States and intends to present no claim which does not irresistably conform to its clearest perceptions of right

tual good will and harmony which
d between the two Republics, ever
ile took her position among the free
ependent nations of the world, will,
ust, be perpetual, and continue to confer
benefits and blessings alike upon each.

The people of the United States, first inaugurated the Era of revolutions, which resulted in the emancipation of South America from foreign domination and in the general establishment of Republican institutions upon this Continent. The Government of the United-States, was the first to recognize the independence of the Spanish American Republics and to urge upon the Governments of Europe a similar recognition. It is therefore not surprising, that sister Republics on this hemisphere and all constitutional Governments throughout Christendom, should deeply deplore the existence of a wicked and causeless insurrection in a portion of the United States, the object of which, is the destruction of that Union and those institutions, which paved the way for civil liberty throughout the world and so greatly elevated and improved the condition of mankind.

Notwithstanding the formidable character of that rebellion and occasional reverses in the field, the integrity of the Union and the stability of the Government WILL NOT and CANNOT be impaired.

The friends of free institutions, who have watched the struggle from its inception, now rejoice in the belief, that the days of the rebellion are numbered, that the United States of America will soon resume its peaceful career in the race of progress and civilization and that the result of the contest will everywhere strengthen and confirm popular Governments and Republican institutions.

Such a consumation, Mr. President, I feel assured, will be hailed with joy and gladness by every constitutional Government and especially by the Governments and people of Chile.

His Excellency the President replied:

MR. MINISTER:

With very great pleasure I shall read the autograph letter of the President of the United States, wherein he acknowledges the receipt of that which I had the honor to trans-

mit him, informing him of my elevation to the Presidency of this Republic and manifesting at the same time my firm intention to maintain the friendly relations which happily have existed and still exist between the two nations.

I am cordially grateful for the congratulation which, for this event, you have come in person to maké to me, at the request and in the name of your Honorable Chief Magistrate.

You say Mr. Minister, that your Government will present no claim which does not irresistibly commend itself to its clearest perceptions of right and justice. I also can assure you, for my part, that I will hasten to satisfy the petitions and demands of your fellow citizens, as well as those of every foreigner, resident in the Republic, whenever they are presented, based upon foundations so solid.

The Chilean, and the entire enlightened world have heard with pain of the breaking out of civil war in the American Union, where law and progress have so well known how to fraternize. But, however formidable may be the present aspect of the contest, it is confidently to be hoped, that her public men, inspired by a noble patriotism and aided by the good sense of the American people, may find some solution to the questions, which divide them, and which accepted by all the States may succeed in restoring peace and harmony to that interesting Republic.

I have received the autograph letter of your Excellency, dated the 24th September last, apprizing me of your elevation to the Supreme Magistracy of the Republic by the vote of the Chilean Nation, and assuring me of your Excellency's best disposition to increase and strengthen the friendly and fraternal relations so happily subsisting between our respective countries.

I offer my sincere congratulations to your

Excellency upon the event which you have communicated to me, and I am happy to believe that the sentiments which inspire your Excellency, and which the Government and people of the United States cordially reciprocate, cannot fail to be productive of the largest benefits to your own nation, while they will promote the best understanding and harmony with others.

Accept my best wishes for your Excellency's personal happiness with the assurances of my profound interest in the welfare and prosperity of the Chilean Nation.

Garcés por haber circulado en cierto pueblo la voz de que su cura no era hombre sino mujer, y por consiguiente de que era incapaz de administrar sacramentos. El juez de primera instancia condenó por difamacion al mencionado Garcés a desdecirse y a cien pesos de multa. Hoi la Corte Suprema, atendiendo a la gravedad y falsedad de la imputacion contra el cura, ha condenado al reo por toda pena a cuatro años de relegacion en la provincia de Valdivia.

El Sr. Garcés habia espuesto en sus escritos que no podia convencérsele de impostura o falsedad por lo que habia divulgado sobre el sexo del cura, hasta que no se practicara el reconocimiento que pusiera en claro la verdad o falsedad del hecho, añadiendo que no comprendia cómo sin practicarse ese reconocimiento ocular hubiera razon natural ni legal para condenarlo. Segun él, el hecho que habia divulgado no era imposible, porque el historiador Llorente asienta la existencia de la papisa Juana; ademas, no hace mucho tiempo, dijo, en el convento de San Francisco de esta capital se halló una mujer extranjera vestida con el traje de la órden franciscana; ella habia morado algun tiempo entre los relijiosos que no sospechaban la falsedad del sexo del lego, y quién sabe hasta qué tiempo hubiera sostenido su falso sexo, si oportunamente no se hubiera descubierto la impostura.

Exhumacion de los restos del Siervo Bardesi.

—Al cabo de dos dias de escavaciones ha sido ayer encontrado a las cuatro y media de la tarde el cajon que contenia los restos del Siervo de Dios Bardesi; y a las diez de la noche fué llevado a la capilla de Ntra. Sra. de Dolores de la misma iglesia de San Francisco. El cajon se encontraba mui conservado, lo que admira considerando que otros cajones enterrados desde hace menos tiempo se han encontrado deshechos o pulverizados.

Esta mañana a las doce del dia se encontraban reunidos en el primer claustro del convento grande de San Francisco un gran número de seglares, de clérigos y religiosos deseosos de asistir al acto de la apertura del cajon y de presenciarse un nuevo prodijio obrado por el Siervo de Dios Bardesi en su sepultura. El tribunal de delegados de Su Santidad presidido por el Sr. Arzobispo de Santiago y acompañado con los médicos, testigos y demas personas agregadas al tribunal, pasó a la capilla donde se encontraba el cajon para proceder a la investigacion y sumaria que habia de practicarse. Entre los testigos llamados se encontraban D. Eujenio Domingo Torres, don Antonio Jacobo y D. Manuel Camilo Vial, D. Antonio Vidal y otras personas respetables. Delante de la reja de la capilla mencionada habia muchos sujetos que con dificultad habian logrado entrar. Dentro de la capilla se estableció el tribunal. Destapado el ataud, los médicos, cirujano y químico empezaron a desocuparlo de lo que encerraba. En este momento el vivo deseo de presenciarse un fenómeno providencial y edificante se pintaba en todas las fisonomias. Despues de dos horas vino a salir el concurso de la ansiedad que lo dominaba, y a sentir una amarga desilusion: el cajon solo contenia unos cuantos huesos, unos pequeños pedazos de hábito franciscano y mucha tierra húmeda y unida; no habia una sola calavera. Sin embargo, se ha comprobado la existencia de cuatro cadáveres encerrados en el tosco féretro, los mismos de que hacen mencion el Sr. Gandarillas en su Vida del Siervo de Dios Bardesi y la tradicion popular.

Los huesos referidos pertenecian, segun dicen los médicos, a cuatro personas; son los huesos que la medicina denomina *fémur*, el hueso mas largo y mas fuerte de todos los del cuerpo, que se estiende desde la *pélvis* hasta la *tibia*, formando la parte sólida del muslo. Se ha notado que uno de los *femures* es mas blanco que los demas huesos, por lo que se infiere que debe ser del cadáver del Siervo Bardesi. La mayor parte de los huesos que faltan a los cuatro cadáveres están reducidos a polvo.

No parece mui estraño que solo ese hueso sea al parecer el único del cadáver de Bardesi, porque, segun dice el Sr. Gandarillas en la Vida que escribió de aquel relijioso lego, «varias veces se abrió el sepulcro del Siervo de Dios, y en ellas sacaban para reliquias los devotos alguna parte de sus huesos.» Fué abierto por última vez el 23 de diciembre de 1733.

La jente devota que se habia ajitado grandemente con la dulce expectativa de un nuevo milagro del relijioso Bardesi y de contar ya el pais con un santo, ha sufrido un gran chasco. Es mui improbable, por consiguiente, que la Santa Sede, aun teniendo por mui ciertos los sorprendentes milagros que narran los procesos que tiene en su poder, beatifique y mucho menos que canonicé al Siervo de Dios Bar-

desi. Se quedará este relijioso con el titulo de relijioso *venerable* que tiene desde hace mucho tiempo.

A las dos de la tarde, cuando nos sepáramos de la iglesia de San Francisco, el tribunal de Delegados y los médicos quedaban haciendo el exámen científico y levantando la sumaria correspondiente.

Habló el mudo?—Estrañamos que nada se nos diga de Santiago, ni en correspondencias ni periódicos, si habló o no el mudo que se llevó a la exhumacion del Siervo de Dios Vardesi. Parece que el *milagro* se ha reducido a conservar el cajon en que estaban los restos, pero tampoco se nos dice a *qué* o a *quién* se debe ese milagro, que no se atrevió a hacer el de juntar los esparcidos huesos del venerable siervo, cuya calavera no ha parecido.

¡Quó fé tan santa hai en la beata capital! Dios la conserve en su gracia para relijiosa es-cepcion en el siglo XIX!
