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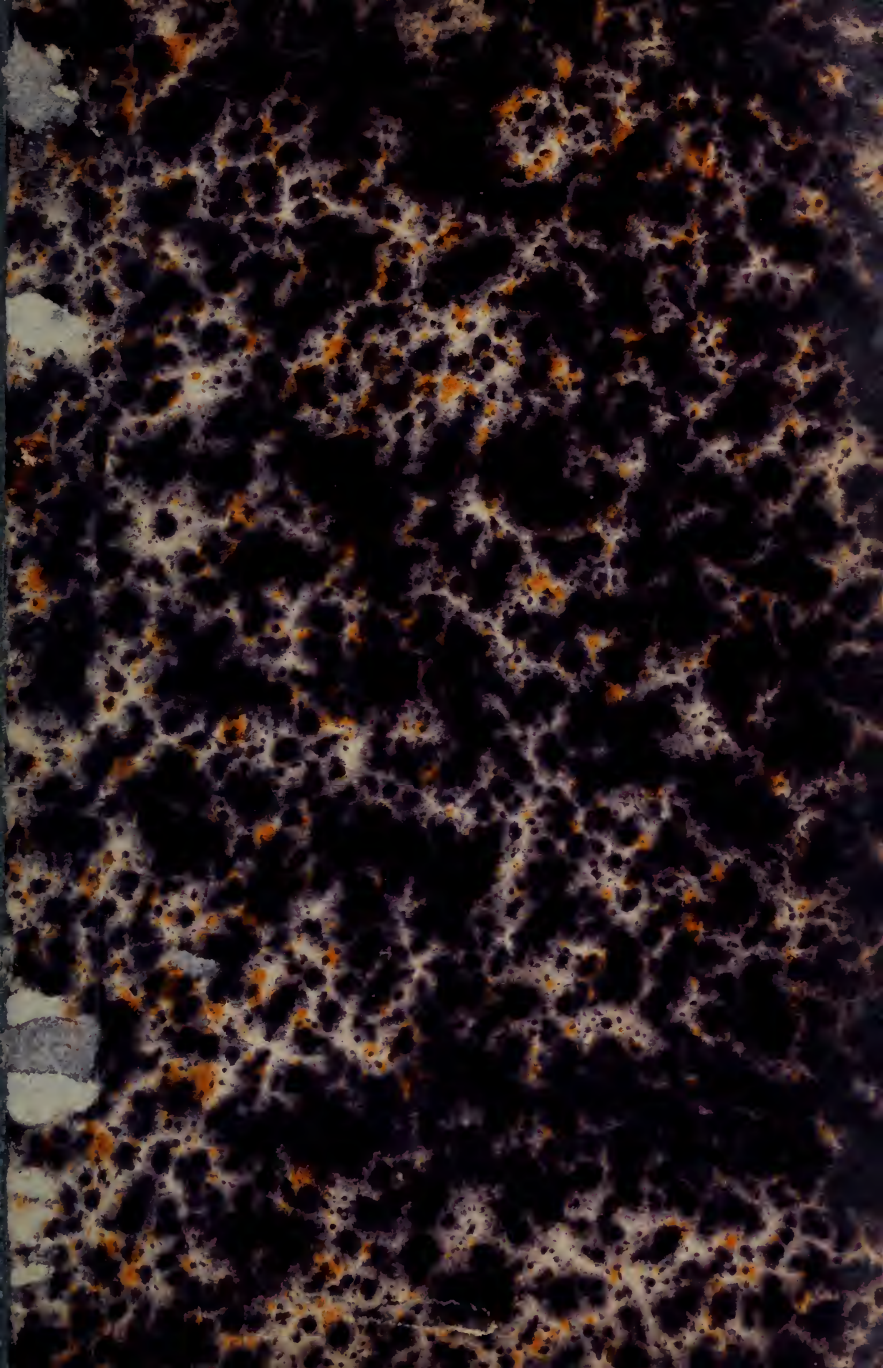

to hear of its collapse at any
time.

If Dr. J. & people will go to
support sailor work as part
of the mission work of their
Church, & will allow you to
work in your own way, you
can do as much work & as
good work as in any other
way for the present at least.

Will they allow you to
work in your own way & gather
your fellowships bands & have
it entirely distinct from the
Chrch:

— or will it be the fellowships
band of union Ch. civil its
members need to be or
become members of that

Church: — can it be allowed
to grow into an Independent Church:
or what wth the idea?

You are aware already I
have no faith in a Union Ch.
as alive earnest soul saving Ch.

on independent lines & are
pledged to continue in this way,
until the people shall choose
their way themselves.

I well understand your
convictions in this matter
I believe our own work

past. I don't think you will

report it to me.

from Mr Taylor this work

connected with him & our Assⁿ
work then I wd say to you
consider such a step well

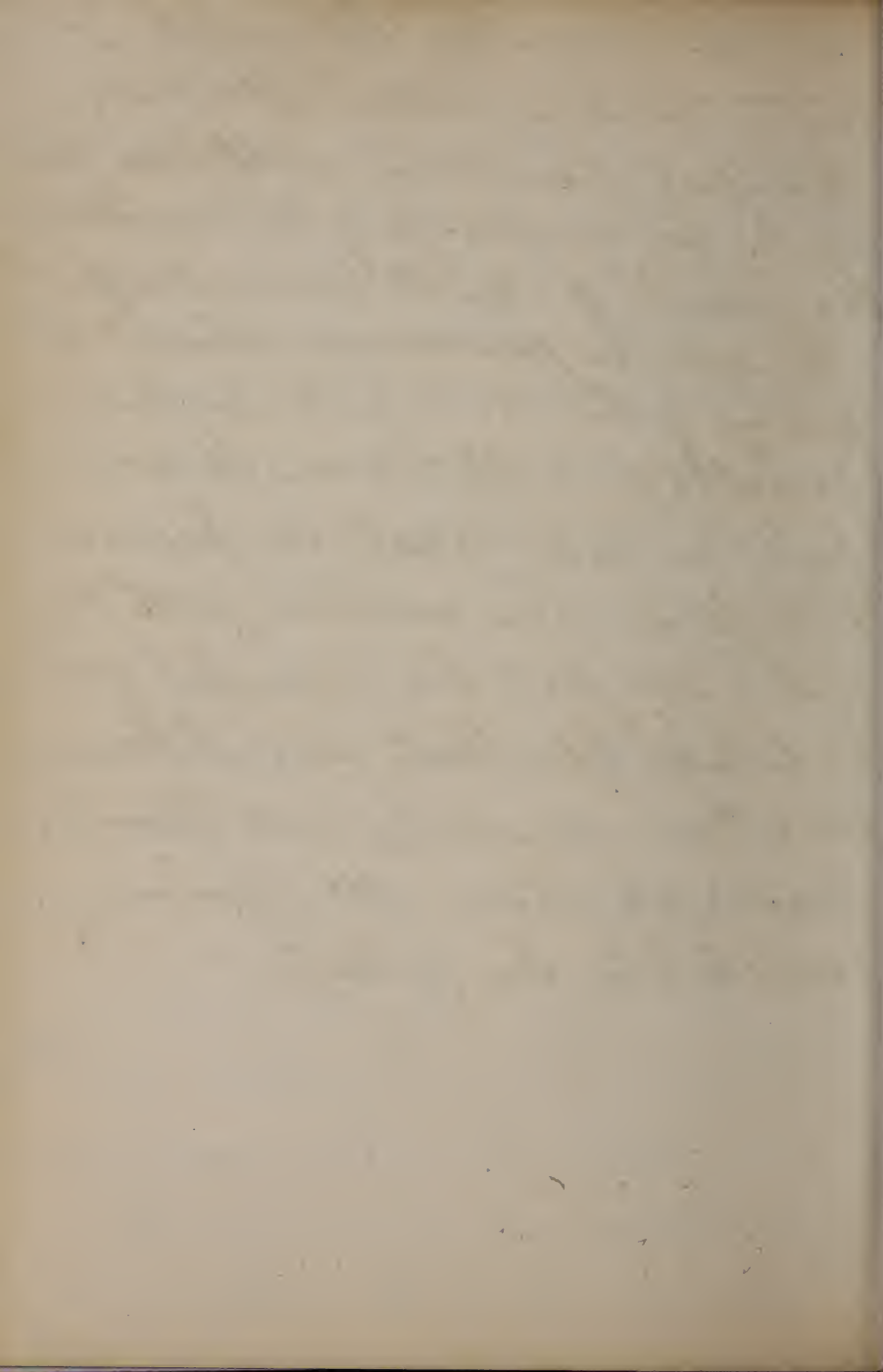

TRIBUTE TO HEROISM.

Tardy Recognition of the Valor of American Sailors.

[From Our Special Correspondent.]

VALPARAISO, S. A., Aug. 30, 1881. A naval engagement in this harbor Feb. 28, 1814, between the United States frigate Essex and two British ships, the Phoebe and the Cherub, resulted unfavorably for the American arms. There was no foreign cemetery here at that period, and the remains of some of the slain, as is supposed, were buried in the forts, from whence they were removed to the present cemetery in 1847. It was suggested to the officers of the Richmond, the American flagship, in 1876, that it was desirable to erect a memorial for the slain in the battle, and they collected a sum of money for the purpose, which was supplemented afterward by the United States ships Omaha, Adams and Pensacola, making \$390 in all. A handsome marble monument, in the form of a sarcophagus, has been erected on a solid base of cement and brickwork, two and a half feet high, on whose four tablets are inscriptions of the names of the officers and seamen, which were obtained from Commodore Porter's book, "A Cruise in the Pacific." The inscription reads as follows: "In memory of the officers and seamen slain on board the U. S. frigate Essex in this harbor in an engagement with H. B. M.'s frigate Phoebe and brig Cherub Feb. 28, 1814:

"Lieut. James P. Wilmer, Lieut. John G. Cowell; Rhucl Marshall, gunner; Francis Bland, quartermaster; Henry Kennedy, boatswain's mate; William Smith, boatswain's mate; John Adams, Peter Allan, John Alviston, James Anderson, Thomas Bailey, George Beden, Thomas Brannock, Thomas Brown, Robert Brown, Henry Buff, Daniel F. Cassimere, William Christopher, John Clinton, Thomas Davis, George Douglass, Lewis F. Earle, Joseph Ferrell, Thomas Ferry, James Folger, Francis Green, Frederic Hall, George Hallet, Benjamin Hazen, George Hill, Mark Hill, John Jackson, William Jennings, Thomas Johnson, William Johnson, Peter Johnston, John C. Killian, William Lee, John Lings, Zachary Mayfield, Samuel Miller, Thomas Mitchell, Thomas Nordyke, Charles E. Norgran, John Rowell, John Ripley, Thomas Russell, James Seilers, Philip Thomas, Cornelius Thompson, Henry Vickers, William White, William Williams, William Wyne, seamen."

One of the tablets bears the following: "Erected in 1881, by Rev. Dr. Trumbull and Gen. L. H. Foote, United States consul, aided by Dr. Howard E. Ames, assistant surgeon, U. S. N., and officers of the United States ships Richmond, Adams, Omaha and Pensacola." Gen. Foote, the United States consul, has manifested his hearty sympathy, cooperating personally and officially in the completion of this work of respect for the valiant dead. The total expenditure has been \$466, leaving a deficit of \$76, of which he has insisted on bearing the larger part.

Your letter of Feb. 15 was very welcome and enclosures so encouraging. I said, why here is the man whom the Lord has been preparing for the post; and seemingly one that takes in the situation so widely and knows its importance. Next mail no doubt I shall hear further from you and about his visit to you.

There is now only one difficulty: I had written in January to Dr. Ellinwood Pres. Bd. For. Missions asking would it not be possible to allow a missionary they were about to send for Spanish work in Santiago to tarry 6 months with us here, as their man loaned to us — to go on with Spanish

work later, unless our congregation
should wish him to remain with
them permanently in which e-
vent it was understood they could
retain him. In case the Bd. consen-
sed they were to send us a telegram
the word Union; and in case
they would send another still for
Santiago - to telegraph the word
Santiago. On the 3rd instant
this latter word came. So that in
May or June one is to come out
whom we can settle in case he is
suited with us and we with him.
But for this Mr. Jenkins would have
been sent for I am sure: and now
I beg you to induce him to remain
where he is until we have a chance
to find out the qualifications of this
brother from N. York. Should he
prove a fitting man for us and be
willing to cast in his lot with

us we feel bound to call him; but
if not there is little doubt Mr. J.
will be sent for. Now will he just
hold on till say January 1883.

Meantime he can be obtaining
more information about us and our
work, and in fact there may be
other openings beside to which if any
be in my power to invite him.

As he has a church now, and also
has had it borne in on him to me-
ditate the conquest of this Canaan
of S. C. for the Gospel, I hope
he may be willing to hold on.

His letters seem to indicate him
to be a man to whom the banner
I have tried to hold up could be
transferred with hope he would
hold up for years to come. On score
of health I am confident he would
find this climate favorable.

You will see we are bound in honor

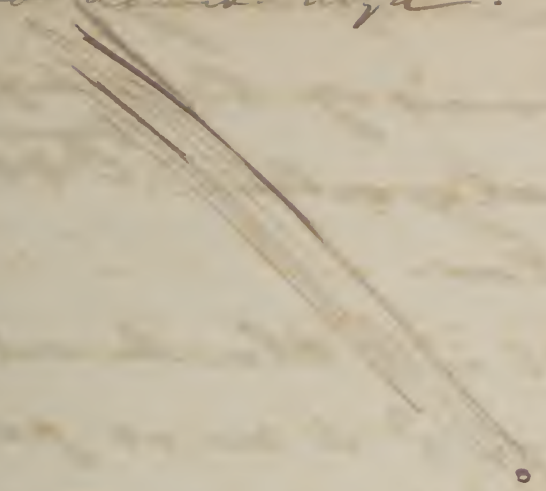

THE SALEM WITCHCRAFT.

Whatever mistakes our fathers made be-
gged to the times, and were fully shared
other civilized peoples. Thousands were
ecuted in the different countries of Europe
this century; four thousand in Scotland,
s said, within ten years, not far from the
e of the Salem witchcraft. Sir Matthew
le condemned four to death about 1664.
ief Justice Holt a few years afterwards
ntenced many more. In Sweden, there
s a manifestation similar to that at Salem,
d occurring about the same time, but more
vere in its consequences.

The excitement at Salem came and went
a twelvemonth. It was a swift and
nding storm that lifted the people from
eir feet and threw them from their bal-
ce for the time; and when it cleared away,
left Massachusetts in advance of the rest
the world on this subject. It was the first
ivilized State to abolish executions for
tchcraft. The last execution in England
as in 1716, and the law making it a capital
onse was repealed in 1736. The last exe-
tion in Scotland was in 1722, and the state-
e against it was repealed in 1736. The last
ecution in Germany was in 1749, and the
st in Switzerland was in 1780. J. M. B.
