1824. Tuesday Sept 7. wet morning - read news - went by printer's - visited Dr Nisbet - called B. Moore and Joel Mathews before faculty & lectured them - p.m. examined Clark - p.m. visited Mr Baldwin at dark - found him very ill.

Mr Hull came & sat & discussed it with me - slept badly.

9. Thursday - wet morning - visited Baldwin - went by Judge Clayton's - shewed him Joel Crawford's letter - corrected several speeches - p.m. rainy - called on Dr Nisbet at 1. - viewed Jos. Walker's Speech - rec^d letter from Tho^s Berrien - at dark Judge C. Maj^r Walker & Dr Nisbey came & sat till 10

10. Friday - quite wet - had fire kindled in study - reviewed speeches - wrote to Geo. W. Smyth at 12 called on Judge C. - shewed him the letter - he shewed me one he had written to a Trustee - p.m. called on Dr. N. shewed him my letter - wrote to P. Harris' father - began a letter to Joel C - d. called at 5 on A. Hull - saw Mr. Stanly - wrote to Gen. Harris - carried it to W^m Moore. Ann Pains lodged here.

1824 Saturday 11 Sept^r Very cloudy morning - rose with headache severe - copied a letter to J.C-d nearly - Fac^y met about J.C.Patterson going to his father's wedding - he went - had vertigo - Maj^r Walker came at 11 & sat till 12. Prudential Committee met at Academy - p.m. wished to visit my plantⁿ but horse lame - visited Dr.Nisbey - absent - saw Chess played - visited The^s Stow - found sundry Citizens - went to College - head ached all day.

12. Sabbath.- preached on Luke 1:74. to few - very cloudy day - James Espey dined - P.M. Mr Stanly preached from Rom. 1:32 - made human nature more innocent than I think the Scripture warrants - at 5 Dr Nisbey called - spoke much of the sermon & College - I read much today in Burnet's defence - slept very badly tonight.

13. Monday - cloudy - corrected Speeches - M.Dobbins came after breakfast - saw Dr.Jackson at E.L.Newton's at Noon - P.M. Maj^r Meriwether went to my room & sat an hour - went home with me - supped. Maj^r Walker & A.Hull met after night I concluded to resign - rec^d no letters this evening - slept indifferently.

14. Tuesday cloudy - went by printer's without Hull - called at Judge Clayton's office while a severe shower of rain fell - saw La Fayette's likeness in Bonaparte's life - reviewed H.Popes & F Sims' speeches - rec^d & read & finished Evan. magazine - also rec^d the Address of the Committee of the Education Society of the Gen^l Assembly - also an Address to

the South Carolinians on the Presidential question. p.m. read a sermon of Blair on the duties of the Aged- after 5 passed E.L.Newton's - saw James Thornton &c drive by- conversed with Eben. Newton about my plantⁿ buying - Isaac & John came home - after supper Dr Nisbet came & sat till 9. This evening was showery & the night stormy.

15. Wednesday - very tempestuous morning indeed - read u? Darham's Astro-Theology - at College read History of France in Encyclopedian - tried to get a Drawer Lock at sundry stores p.m. got one at Nevill's after 5. read Derham visited Mrs. Sibbold Mrs Millidge &c.-

16. Thursday - still cloudy- carried my shoe to Welch at 9 - read history of France - finished Derham early- Mr Benson called before & after noon- Rec^d a letter from Dr/Cumming near 5.by Mr Grant very heavy rain at 5 & loud thunder in Chapel - Mail did not arrive - read Address to S^c Carolinians concerning presidential Election- read News of Iturbide's being shot.

Sept^r . 17. Friday. Very clear morning. prepared for the Senior Exhibition today. Seniors exhibited except three. Mrs.Daugherty dined - unwell - & staid all night. Dr Pierce preached at night to many.

18. Saturday - had vertigo all day - in the forenoon badly- wrote my resignation to Joel Crawford - shewed it to Maj^r Walker, Dr Nisbet & A.Hull at Mr.Goldings appraisement -
